League reps! Thanks to all the curlers who stepped up to be League Rep this year. Your League Reps are the liaison between you, the curlers on the ice, and the club's board, via Diane Thiesen, the League and Registration Director. If you have questions, concerns, requests, or ideas talk to your rep who will pass your thoughts on. And if Diane has information for you, she'll talk to your rep who will talk to you.

Diane and your League Reps want to help make each league a good experience for all the curlers.

"When will you pay me"

An old children's rhyme "Oranges and lemons" asks "When will you pay me: Say the bells of Old Bailey". Unlike the "bells of Shoreditch" we can't wait until you "grow rich". It's important that you make all league payments and fees before the curling session begins. While most of us pay for our curling at registration or shortly after we have a handful of curlers who we repeatedly must ask for payment, sometimes weeks into a curling season. And that's not fair to most of you who do pay promptly.

As a result, the board has passed a motion that says "Curlers are expected to have made all payments they owe before the curling session begins. **Payments made after a league or event begins will be subject to a late penalty of \$50."**

Help! We're short a curler

We've all been there. We're one short at last minute and trying to find a spare in a hurry. Our spares list is on the Club noticeboard but it's a short list! If you're willing to spare on any league, please add your name and contact information on the sheet (print neatly!)

Meanwhile, once registration starts for the winter leagues, you'll see a question asking if you are willing to spare. You'll have to answer yes or no (for each league you register for – sorry but there are limits to technology sometimes). Just provide any information about your availability and position preferences for the first league on your list. After that a 'see previous answer' or "see above" will suffice. Remember that curlers registered to play in a league (and have paid their Curl BC fees) may spare on any other league without charge.

We're trying this new process within the curling.io registration app and may finetune it for next year if needed. We hope the question will nudge us all to consider sparing. And our hardworking Leagues Director, Diane Thiesen, will be able to generate the spares list more quickly after registration closes.

Etiquette tips of the month:

- Arrive on time and wear clean, appropriate footwear that will not damage the ice.
- Be ready to go when it's your turn to deliver a rock.


1st prize: One 65-inch LG Smart TV with A5 processor 4K Gen7

Rule update: No Tick Rule



Last year Curling Canada adopted the No Tick Rule and this year CurlBC has added it to their rule book.

What is the rule? Simply stated: The No-Tick Shot rule states that rocks touching the centre line in the Free Guard Zone (i.e. in front of the house) cannot be removed off the centre line until the sixth stone of an end. If a rock has been moved off the line, the non-offending team has the choice of removing the thrown rock and replacing all rocks to their previous position or leaving all rocks where they came to rest.

The rule does not apply to Doubles or Sturling curling. Each league will have (or has had) the option of choosing to adopt the rule or not for the remainder of the season. If you aren't sure if the rule applies in your league, ask your league rep.
