- Our bonspiels are run with generous donations, registration fees, and fundraising such as raffles and 50-50 draws. After paying expenses, there is often a profit and some of the funds are kept in the bonspiel account as seed money for the next year. The committees typically give residue funds back to the club and we use it for expenses such as the monitors, ice maintenance equipment, rocks, etc. The back accounts are included in the club's annual report.
